101	CONCERNING THE INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL MENTAL
102	DISORDERS IN THE MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE
103	FOR MENTAL ILLNESS, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,
104	DEFINING MENTAL DISORDER AS A CONDITION CLASSIFIED AS A
105	MENTAL DISORDER IN THE NINTH REVISION OF THE
106	INTERNATIONAL CLASSIFICATION OF DISEASES AND EXCLUDING
107	SPECIFIED CONDITIONS DEFINED AS MENTAL DISORDERS
108	THEREIN.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.) Expands mandatory health insurance coverage to require coverage for mental disorders as defined in the 9th revision of the international classification of diseases (ICD-9). Excludes the following mental disorders defined in the ICD-9 from the mandatory coverage provision:

Homosexuality; and Tobacco use disorder.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. 10-16-104 (5.5) (a), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3	amended to read:
4	10-16-104. Mandatory coverage provisions. (5.5) Biologically
5	based mental illness and mental disorders. (a) (I) Every group policy,
6	plan certificate, and contract of a carrier subject to the provisions of part
7	2, 3, or 4 of this article, except those described in section 10-16-102 (21)
8	(b), shall provide coverage for the treatment of biologically based mental
9	illness that is no less extensive than the coverage provided for any
10	other A physical illness.
11	(II) EVERY GROUP POLICY, PLAN CERTIFICATE, AND CONTRACT OF
12	A CARRIER SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PART 2, 3, OR 4 OF THIS
13	ARTICLE, EXCEPT A SMALL GROUP PLAN, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 10-16-102
14	(42), AND A POLICY OR PLAN AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 10-16-102 (21) (b),
15	SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR THE TREATMENT OF MENTAL DISORDERS
16	THAT IS NO LESS EXTENSIVE THAN THE COVERAGE PROVIDED FOR A
17	PHYSICAL ILLNESS.
18	(III) Any preauthorization or utilization review mechanism used
19	in the determination to provide <u>such THE</u> coverage <u>REQUIRED BY THIS</u>
20	PARAGRAPH (a) shall be the same as, or no more restrictive than, that used
21	in the determination to provide coverage for any other physical illness.
22	The commissioner shall adopt such rules as are necessary to carry out the

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1	provisions of this subsection (5.5). In promulgating such rules, the
2	commissioner shall recognize that the substance of the mechanisms for
3	preauthorization or utilization review may differ between medical
4	specialties and that such mechanisms shall not be more restrictive with
5	respect to a covered person or a mental health provider for a
6	determination under this <u>subparagraph (I) PARAGRAPH (a)</u> than for any
7	other physical illness.
8	$\underline{\text{(II)}}$ (IV) As used in this subsection (5.5):
9	(A) "Biologically based mental illness" means schizophrenia,
10	schizoaffective disorder, bipolar affective disorder, major depressive
11	disorder, specific obsessive-compulsive disorder, and panic disorder.
12	(B) "MENTAL DISORDER" MEANS ANY CONDITION DEFINED AS A
13	MENTAL DISORDER IN THE INTERNATIONAL CLASSIFICATION OF DISEASES,
14	NINTH REVISION (ICD-9), EXCLUDING THE MENTAL DISORDERS SPECIFIED
15	BY THE FOLLOWING CODE NUMBERS, AS SAID CODE NUMBERS EXISTED ON
16	January 1, 2007: <u>299.0, infantile autism;</u> 302.0, <u>homosexuality;</u>
17	305.1, TOBACCO USE <u>DISORDER</u> ; 315, SPECIFIC DELAYS IN DEVELOPMENT;
18	317, MILD MENTAL RETARDATION; 318, OTHER SPECIFIED MENTAL
19	RETARDATION; AND 319, UNSPECIFIED MENTAL RETARDATION.
20	SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability. This act shall take
21	effect January 1, 2008, and shall apply to group health insurance policies,
22	plans, or contracts offered, issued, or renewed on or after said date.
23	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
24	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate

preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
