To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on HB09-1342, concerning the 54 elimination of the state sales and use tax exemption for cigarettes, and making an 55 appropriation in connection therewith, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the 56 following:

- 1. That the House accede to the Senate amendments made to the bill, as the 59 amendments appear in the rerevised bill.
- 2. That, under the authority granted the committee to consider matters not at issue between the two houses, the following amendments be recommended:

Amend rerevised bill, page 2, after line 14, insert the following:

(c) Notwithstanding any provision of Law to the contrary, for any 67

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LOCAL GOVERNMENT OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE THAT LEVIES A SALES OR USE TAX BASED ON THE SALES OR USE TAX LEVIED BY THE STATE PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE, THE SALE OR STORAGE, USE, OR CONSUMPTION OF CIGARETTES AFTER JUNE 30, 2009, AND BEFORE JULY 1, 2011, SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE SALES OR USE TAX OF SUCH LOCAL GOVERNMENT OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISION.

SECTION 2. 29-1-204.5 (3) (f.1) (I), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

- 29-1-204.5. Establishment of multijurisdictional housing authorities. (3) The 10 general powers of such authority shall include the following powers:
- (f.1) (I) Subject to the provisions of subsection (7.5) of this section, to levy, in all 13 of the area within the boundaries of the authority, a sales or use tax, or both, at a rate not 14 to exceed one percent, upon every transaction or other incident with respect to which a 15 sales or use tax is levied by the state, EXCLUDING THE SALE OR USE OF CIGARETTES. The tax imposed pursuant to this paragraph (f.1) is in addition to any other sales or use tax imposed pursuant to law. The executive director of the department of revenue shall 18 collect, administer, and enforce the sales or use tax, to the extent feasible, in the manner 19 provided in section 29-2-106. However, the executive director shall not begin the 20 collection, administration, and enforcement of a sales and use tax until such time as the 21 financial officer of the authority and the executive director have agreed on all necessary 22 matters pursuant to subparagraph (III) of paragraph (e) of subsection (2) of this section. The executive director shall begin the collection, administration, and enforcement of a 24 sales and use tax on a date mutually agreeable to the department of revenue and the 25 authority.".

- (B) Upon which specific ownership tax has been paid or is payable if the 51 purchaser resides outside the boundaries of the authority or the purchaser's principal place 52 of business is outside the boundaries of the authority and if the personal property is registered or required to be registered outside the boundaries of the authority; OR
 - (C) WHERE SUCH TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY IS A CIGARETTE.".Renumber 56 succeeding sections accordingly.

FIRST REPORT OF FIRST CONFERENCE COMMITTEE ON HB09-1137

THIS REPORT AMENDS THE REREVISED BILL

To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on HB09-1137, concerning intercepts, and, in connection therewith, intercepting gambling winnings to pay outstanding restitution, and requiring the department of revenue to provide specified information to state agencies in conjunction with intercepts of tax refunds, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

That the House accede to the Senate amendments made to the bill, as the amendments appear in the rerevised bill, with the following changes:

Amend rerevised bill, page 3, strike lines 11 through 27.

Page 4, strike line 1 and substitute the following:

"(c.5) (I) For allocation during the state fiscal years 2010-11 and 2011-12, based on recommendations from the advisory board, to the gambling payment intercept cash fund created in section 24-35-605.5, for use by the department of revenue in accordance with section 24-35-605.5 (2) (a); except that moneys shall not be allocated for such purpose unless all other permissible distributions and allocations have been made from the fund.

(II) THIS PARAGRAPH (c.5) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,2012.".

THE REQUEST SHALL INCLUDE THE ITEMS LISTED IN THIS SUBSECTION (2) AND MAY INCLUDE ANY ADDITIONAL INFORMATION THAT MAY ASSIST THE BUREAU IN LOCATING THE RECORDS OF ARREST OR CHARGES OR THE BIOLOGICAL SUBSTANCE SAMPLE OR TESTING RESULTS. THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE SUBMITTED REQUEST:
 - (a) THE PERSON'S NAME, DATE OF BIRTH, AND MAILING ADDRESS;
- (b) THE NAME OF THE AGENCY THAT COLLECTED THE BIOLOGICAL SUBSTANCE SAMPLE;
- (c) The date of arrest or other date when the sample was taken;
- (d) Whether any charges were filed stemming from the arrest for which a biological substance sample was collected, the identity of the court, and the case number of each case in which charges were filed; and
- (e) A DECLARATION THAT, TO THE BEST OF THE PERSON'S KNOWLEDGE, HE OR SHE QUALIFIES FOR EXPUNGEMENT.
- (3) UPON RECEIPT OF A REQUEST SATISFYING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, THE COLORADO BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION SHALL PROMPTLY SUBMIT A WRITTEN INQUIRY TO THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY IN THE JURISDICTION IN WHICH THE PERSON'S BIOLOGICAL SUBSTANCE SAMPLE WAS COLLECTED CONCERNING THE OUTCOME OF THE ARREST OR CHARGES.
