TITLE: CONCERNING FILE RETENTION BY ATTORNEYS OF RECORD IN FELONY CRIMINAL CASES.**Summary of Legislation**

The bill specifies the following required time periods for an attorney to retain files in a criminal case:

- the life of the defendant for class 1 felonies;
- the life of the defendant for a felony sex offense; and
- five years for all other felonies.

The bill takes effect on September 1, 2010.

Assessment

The bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact. It standardizes the policies for file retention in criminal cases. Public defenders already have a similar policy and most district attorneys offices also retain files for at least the specified time periods. It is not expected to increase the workload for any state agency.
