Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 2/2/10 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note Was Prepared (Amended by the Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee 2/18/10)

The Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee Report made the following changes:

- changed the maximum fee allowed for the Aspen Leaf Lifetime Pass from \$150.00 to not to exceed five times the cost of the Aspen Leaf Annual Pass;
- inserted language to state that the Aspen Leaf Lifetime Pass shall not be sold on or after March 1, 2014;
- inserted language requiring the Department of Natural Resources to submit a report evaluating the Aspen Leaf Lifetime Pass.

The changes made by the Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee Report do not change the fiscal impact of the bill. Legislative Council staff concurs with this JBC staff assessment.
