Summary of Legislation

This bill clarifies that the following information about a protection order or subsequent order should be entered into the central registry of protection orders maintained by the Colorado Bureau of Investigation:

- the amount of bail, if any;
- any conditions of bond set by the court in the case in which the protection order was entered; and
- the highest classified crime charged in the case, if any.

State Expenditures

Judicial Department. The department will require \$38,400 from the General Fund in FY 2010-11. The courts are required to send information that is not currently sent to the central registry of protection orders. The computer database will need to be reprogrammed to include new fields for the additional information. The fiscal note assumes this will take approximately 520 hours of programming time at \$74 per hour, for a total one-time cost of \$38,400.

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State Appropriations

The Judicial Department requires a General Fund appropriation of \$38,400 in FY 2010-11.
