Summary of Legislation

This bill continues the Workers' Compensation Classification Appeals Board until July 1, 2021, as recommended by the 2009 Sunset Review. The bill is effective upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

Background

The 6-member board hears appeals from employers regarding either their classifications or experience modification factors, both of which assist in determining the premium employers pay for workers' compensation insurance coverage. Board decisions are considered final actions for administrative purposes and may only be appealed to the Commissioner of Insurance. Administrative functions related to the board are performed by staff from the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI).

Assessment

This bill is assessed at no fiscal impact. Because NCCI staff serve as the administrative liaison to the board, the state has no expenditures or staffing associated with the board.
