CONCERNING A STUDY TO EVALUATE THE FEASIBILITY OF A SYSTEM TO DETERMINE PUPIL ENROLLMENT FOR PURPOSES OF THE "PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCE ACT OF 1994" BASED ON THE AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP OF

PUPILS IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Appropriation Summary for FY 2010-2011: None required, see State Appropriations section.

Summary of Legislation

This bill, recommended by the Interim Committee to Study School Finance, directs the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) to contract for a study evaluating the feasibility and impact of determining pupil enrollment based on average daily membership (ADM), the average number of days that pupils are enrolled in school during a school year rather than attendance on October 1 of the applicable budget year as is done under current law. However, the bill specifies that CDE shall only contract for the study if it can cover the study costs with:

- federal "Race to the Top" moneys;
- federal funding from another source; or
- gifts, grants, or donations.

^{*} State revenue and expenditures represent a minimum required amount, and are conditional on support from federal funds or gifts, grants and donations. State revenue exceeds state expenditures to cover both the costs noted in the State Expenditures section and the Expenditures Not Included section of this fiscal note.

The bill requires CDE's School Finance Unit to oversee the study, and requires CDE to incorporate in the study any previous studies or information gathered regarding average daily membership. CDE must notify the education committees of the General Assembly when sufficient funding is received for the study, and indicate the date by which it is authorized to spend the funding. CDE must submit a report summarizing findings to the education committees of the General Assembly within two years of that date.

The bill prohibits the use of state moneys for conducting the study, but authorizes CDE to receive gifts, grants, and donations for that purpose. The bill creates the Average Daily Membership Study Fund in the state treasury and specifies that any gifts, grants, or donations received for the study be deposited into the fund. The bill is repealed 3 years after the authorized date, and all moneys remaining in the fund are transferred to the State Education Fund.

State Revenue

This bill authorizes the CDE to seek, accept, and spend federal moneys and other gifts, grants, and donations to finance a study evaluating the use of ADM as a method for determining student enrollment. Based on the expenditures described in this fiscal note, in FY 2010-11, the CDE would need to obtain at least \$7,689 to prepare a request for proposals (RFP) to contract for the study. In FY 2011-12, the CDE would need to obtain \$237,766 to contract for the study and support the contractor. To date, no specific revenue source has been identified.

State Expenditures

In FY 2010-11, the CDE will incur costs of \$5,803 and 0.1 FTE for administrative expenses. In FY 2011-12, costs will rise to \$205,803, including administrative expenses and the expense of the contracted study. *These costs are conditional on the receipt of sufficient federal or private funds*. Table 1 details these expenses.

Program Administration - \$5,803 and 0.1 FTE. The bill authorizes CDE to contract for a study evaluating the feasibility and impact of determining pupil enrollment based on ADM. Subject to the receipt of sufficient money from federal sources and private donations, the CDE will: prepare a request for proposals (RFP) to contract for the study, review proposals and prepare the contract, and support the contractor. Additionally, CDE will monitor receipt of funding and provide internal summary progress reports.

Average Daily Membership Study - \$200,000. Because similar studies have ranged in cost between \$100,000 and \$250,000, the cost of this study is anticipated to be \$200,000. Due to the timing of the RFP process, these funds would not be expended until FY 2011-12. If sufficient funds were obtained to conduct the study, it would take approximately one year to issue the RFP and select a contractor under state purchasing guidelines, and an additional 6 to 12 months to conduct the study and complete the report.

Expenditures Not Included

Pursuant to a Joint Budget Committee policy, certain costs associated with this bill are addressed through the annual budget process and centrally appropriated in the Long Bill or supplemental appropriations bills, rather than in this bill. The centrally appropriated costs subject to this policy are summarized in Table 2.
