TITLE: CONCERNING THE ORDER IN WHICH STATEWIDE BALLOT MEASURES APPEAR

ON A BALLOT.

Summary of Legislation

The bill changes the order that statewide ballot measures appear on the ballot. Table 1 provides a summary of the order under current law and under the bill.

Table 1. Order of Statewide Ballot Measures	
Current Law	SB 10-216
1. Initiated amendments	1. Referred amendments
2. Referred amendments	2. Initiated amendments
3. Initiated propositions	3. Referred propositions
4. Referred propositions	4. Initiated propositions

The bill is effective upon signature of the Governor or becoming law without his signature, and applies to the 2010 election.

Assessment

The bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact. Changing the order of ballot measures will not affect printing or postage costs for county clerks and will not increase workload in any state agency.
