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Amendments/Appropriation Status

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause. Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision adjusting FY 2010-11 Long Bill appropriations as detailed in the following table.

Please note that the above table includes several adjustments that are not reflected in the "State Appropriations" section of the Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note (attached). These adjustments are required for two reasons:

- Three line item appropriations from the State Public School Fund are adjusted to change the source of funds from rental income to interest income as required by the House Education Committee Report (see page 3, line 11, through page 4, line 10, of the Report); and
- Two line item appropriations need to be adjusted to reflect a decrease in reappropriated funds that are transferred from the Facility School Funding line item to support educational services provided by the Colorado School for the Deaf and the Blind and the Colorado Mental Health Institutes.

Alternative Appropriation Clause

As indicated in the above table, this bill will reduce FY 2010-11 State Education Fund expenditures by a total of \$1,608,887. These moneys would remain in fund balance and be available for appropriation in the future. The General Assembly could choose to use these savings to further assist in addressing the FY 2010-11 General Fund revenue shortfall.

Specifically, the General Assembly could increase the appropriation from the State Education Fund for the State Share of Districts' Total Program Funding for FY 2010-11 by \$1,608,887, and decrease the General Fund appropriation for the State Share by the same amount. Staff has prepared an **alternate amendment** (**J.002**, attached) in the event that the Appropriations Committee chooses to do so. This amendment **would result in total General Fund savings of \$366,921,427, and no net change in State Education Fund expenditures.**

The Committee should adopt J.001 or J.002, but not both.

Bill Sponsor Amendments

Staff is not aware of any sponsor amendments to be offered.

Points to Consider

The general appropriations bill for FY 2010-11 has not yet been introduced and the Joint Budget Committee has not yet finalized its budget balancing package for FY 2010-11. Based on Legislative Council Staff's December 2009 revenue projection, adjusted to reflect supplemental appropriation bills and revenue enhancement bills passed to date, General Fund revenues will fall about \$550 million short of funding General Fund obligations in FY 2010-11. This bill is anticipated to reduce General Fund expenditures in FY 2010-11 by \$365.3 million, thereby decreasing the General Fund shortfall.
