Summary of Legislation

This bill establishes a 13-member task force to study the assessment and classification of agricultural and residential land and propose legislation to ensure that land is valued based on its actual use. The bill specifies membership on the task force and requires that the task force meet not more than 6 times during the 2010 interim. The task force is to consider issues related to agricultural land classification including:

- the current system of agricultural and residential property in Colorado;
- the fiscal, land use, and other impacts of the state's current classification system; and
- any ideas for improving the current classification system.

The bill requires the task force to submit a written report their findings, including any recommended legislation to Legislative Council by October 15, 2010.

State Expenditures

The Legislative Branch is budgeted each year with resources to support a limited number of interim committees of the General Assembly (6 to 8) as provided for by joint resolution of the Legislative Council, or by resolution of the Executive Committee of the Legislative Council as established by Section 2-3-303.3, C.R.S.

If this interim task force is not designated by the Legislative Council to be one of the prioritized committees, or if the costs of this interim task force are not included in the budgeted amount, the Legislative Department will incur additional costs of \$24,776 General Fund and 0.4 FTE in FY 2010-11, as shown in Table 1 to support the interim task force. These costs are for staff support and reimbursement of member expenses.

Expenditures Not Included

State Appropriations

If this interim task force is not designated by the Legislative Council to be one of the prioritized committees, or if the costs of this interim committee are not included in the budgeted amount, the Legislative Branch will require a General Fund appropriation of \$24,776 and 0.4 FTE for FY 2010-11.
