## **Summary of Legislation**

This bill is recommended by the JBC as part of the budget balancing package. It repeals a telemedicine pilot program conducted by the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing. The pilot program studies the use of telemedicine to manage and treat patients with congestive heart failure, diabetes, and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. The bill adjusts the FY 2009-10 Long Bill appropriations.

## **State Expenditures**

This bill results in expenditure reductions for the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing of \$317,000 in FY 2009-10 and \$380,000 per year beginning in FY 2010-11. The telehealth disease management contract for the pilot program was suspended by executive order in August 2009 and this bill eliminates the statutory requirement for the program. Reduced expenditures reflect the elimination of this contract. This analysis assumes that the program would continue on after its current repeal date of July 1, 2010.

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## **State Appropriations**

The bill includes the required appropriations for FY 2009-10. Reduced expenditures in FY 2010-11 will be addressed through budget process.
