## **Summary of Legislation**

No later than January 1, 2011, this bill requires that the State Board of Education adopt new standards for state entities to use when authorizing charter schools. Entities that authorize charter schools include public school districts and the state Charter School Institute (CSI). The bill specifies some minimum standards the board is required to adopt. The standards are to serve as a reference in decisions on charter school approvals, renewals, revocations, and appeals. The state board may appoint a committee of educators, parents, industry leaders, and other interested parties to assist in developing the standards.

No later than July 1, 2011, each local board of education and the CSI must certify that they meet or exceed the adopted standards when authorizing charter schools. The bill permits a third party that meets the adopted standards to contract to perform authorizing functions. The third party may include the CSI or a Board of Cooperative Educational Services.

#### **State Expenditures**

In FY 2010-11, this bill will result in total expenditures of \$43,194 General Fund and 0.5 FTE in the Colorado Department of Education. The department requires staff in FY 2010-11 to organize meetings and provide support to the appointed committee, research and develop specified

standards for charter school authorization, coordinate with department administration, and propose standards for adoption by the state board. Staff will also assist with collecting the required certification from each local board of education and the CSI. Staff will have travel costs to facilitate regional meetings and to ensure statewide input and participation. Total expenditures are displayed in Table 1.

### **Expenditures Not Included**

#### **School District Impact**

School districts and the Charter School Institute will need to participate in the adoption of standards, review proposals, attend technical assistance and training sessions, and certify that standards are incorporated into school charters and contracts. Participation in this process is not anticipated to create an administrative burden for local school districts and the effort needed to assist the board to adopt standards can be met with existing resources.
