**Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 02/03/10 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note Was Prepared (Amended by the House on Second Reading 02/17/10)**

The House amended the bill to:

- Clarify and modify definitions in the bill.
- Specify that state board rules concerning licensing of neighborhood youth organizations shall not concern staff-to-youth ratios.
- Strike requirements prohibiting a neighborhood youth organization from employing individuals or volunteers who have been convicted of any of the criminal offenses in Section 26-6-104 (7) (a) (I), C.R.S., who have a pattern of misdemeanor convictions as described in Section 26-6-107(7) (a) (I) (E), C.R.S., or who have been found responsible in a confirmed report of child abuse or neglect. Instead, prohibit use of employees or volunteers convicted of felony child abuse as specified in Section 18-6-401, C.R.S. or a felony offense involving unlawful sexual behavior as defined in section 16-22-102 (9), C.R.S.
- Modify and clarify background check requirements.
- Eliminate a provision protecting a youth organization from civil liability for refusing to hire an individual or to authorize a volunteer based on a background check.

These amendments do not change the fiscal impact of the bill as reflected in the Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note dated February 3, 2010. Legislative Council Staff concurs with this analysis.
