Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

Section 1 of the bill makes legislative findings concerning the Colorado student assessment program (CSAP) and states the legislature's intent to replace the current assessments administered in the 9th, 10th, and 11th grades, starting in the 2010-11 academic year.

The general assembly also states its expectations with regard to the

new statewide assessment system that the state board of education (state board) is developing.

Sections 2 through 4 address changes to assessments administered under the existing CSAP. Detailed language concerning the statewide assessments administered through the CSAP is repealed and replaced with a general requirement to administer the CSAP in reading, writing, mathematics and science. However, the department of education (department) will:

- Replace the 9th-grade CSAP assessments with the postsecondary and workforce planning assessment, to be administered by the state starting in the 2010-11 academic year;
- ! Replace the 10th-grade CSAP assessments with the postsecondary and workforce preparation assessment, to be administered by the state starting in the 2011-12 academic year; and
- ! Replace the 11th-grade curriculum-based, achievement college entrance exam with the postsecondary and workforce readiness assessment to be administered by the state starting in the 2012-13 academic year.

The CSAP is repealed, effective July 1, 2013.

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Sections 5 through 12 of the bill address the new statewide assessment system (system) that the state board is developing. The dates for adopting the new system and related changes are extended; the state board is required to adopt the postsecondary and workforce planning, preparation, and readiness assessments within the next 3 years and to ensure that the entire system is in place no later than the 2013-14 academic year. The system is to include statewide, summative assessments only in mathematics and reading, as adopted by the state board working with a state consortia. The system will also include formative and interim assessments adopted and administered by the local education providers. The state board, by rule, will specify minimum parameters for the interim assessments. The results of the statewide summative assessments and the postsecondary and workforce readiness assessments are the only assessment data that the department may collect and include in the Colorado growth model. The local education providers are to use the results of the formative and interim assessments for diagnostic purposes.

The state board will convene an assessment stakeholder committee (committee) to assist in designing the system. The department will also work with the committee to create a resource bank of interim assessments, best practices, rubrics, and other tools to support local education providers adopting and implementing their assessments. To the extent practicable and economically feasible, the new system is to include, but is not limited to, on-line and electronic assessments. All of the assessments included in the system must be valid and reliable, measure twenty-first century skills, and provide relevant, useable information.

Because of changes to accreditation previously enacted, the bill repeals as obsolete language referring to school performance ratings.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly

3 hereby finds that:

4 (a) The federal "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001", 20 U.S.C. 5 sec. 6301 et seq., requires states to administer a statewide, standardized 6 test in reading or language arts and in mathematics annually to all 7 students enrolled in public schools in grades three through eight and once 8 to students enrolled in grades nine through twelve and to administer a 9 statewide, standardized test in science once to students enrolled in grades 10 three through five, once to students enrolled in grades six through nine, 11 and once to students enrolled in grades ten through twelve;

(b) Since the 2005-06 school year, the department of education,
through the Colorado student assessment program, has been administering
more assessments than are required by federal law, resulting in greater
expense to the state, including tests in both reading and writing for
students enrolled in grades three through ten, and tests in reading, writing,
and mathematics at both of grades nine and ten;

18 (c) With the recent downturn in economic conditions and the 19 extreme stress these conditions are causing for the state budget, it is even 20 more important that, in spending its limited resources on assessments, the 21 state ensure that the information obtained from those assessments is 22 timely and useful for teachers, students and parents;

(d) It is therefore in the best interests of the state to replace the

ninth grade statewide assessments in reading, writing, and mathematics
with a postsecondary and workforce readiness planning assessment
identified through the postsecondary and workforce readiness
assessments pilot program pursuant to section 22-7-1007, Colorado
Revised Statutes, to be administered statewide at state expense beginning
in the 2010-11 academic year;

7 (e) Savings realized by the state as a result of replacing the ninth 8 grade statewide assessments with the postsecondary and workforce 9 readiness planning assessment will be sufficient to pay the costs of 10 administering the postsecondary and workforce planning assessment and 11 the postsecondary and workforce preparation assessment, both of which 12 will provide more useful, relevant information for teachers, students, and 13 parents than is provided by the existing ninth and tenth grade statewide 14 assessments;

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(f) It is therefore in the best interests of the state that:

16 (I) Beginning in the 2011-12 academic year, the state board of 17 education replace the statewide assessments in reading, writing, 18 mathematics, and science in tenth grade with administration, at state 19 expense, of the postsecondary and workforce preparation assessments 20 identified through the postsecondary and workforce readiness 21 assessments pilot program pursuant to section 22-7-1007, Colorado 22 Revised Statutes; and

(II) Beginning in the 2012-13 academic year, the state board of
education replace the standardized, curriculum-based, achievement,
college entrance examination in eleventh grade with administration, at
state expense, of the postsecondary and workforce readiness assessment
identified through the postsecondary and workforce readiness

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assessments pilot program pursuant to section 22-7-1007, Colorado
 Revised Statutes.

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(2) The general assembly further finds that:

(a) In 2008, the general assembly enacted the "Preschool to
Postsecondary Education Alignment Act", part 10 of article 7 of title 22,
Colorado Revised Statutes, which requires the state board of education to
adopt new state model content standards and a new system of assessments
to use in measuring students' mastery of those standards. The state board
of education adopted the new state model content standards in December
2009 and is now beginning to design the new system of assessments.

(b) The state board of education is now soliciting input from the elementary, secondary, and postsecondary education communities in the state concerning the design of the new system of assessments and has formed an assessment stakeholder advisory committee to assist the department of education in designing the new system of assessments;

(c) Colorado has also signed a memorandum of understanding
with and serves as a lead state within a consortium of states that is
working to develop reliable, open source, on-line summative assessments
that will be capable of measuring student academic growth in the subjects
of mathematics and reading. The state board of education anticipates
including these summative assessments in the new system of assessments.

(d) The new system of assessment should include statewide
standardized, summative tests only to the extent these tests are required
by federal law and developed by the consortium of states. Any additional
statewide summative assessments should be subject to approval of the
general assembly based on the availability of sufficient moneys to fully
pay the costs to both the state and local education providers of developing

1 and administering the assessments.

(e) The majority of the new system of assessments should consist
of formative and interim assessments, selected and administered by local
education providers, that provide rapid, usable, relevant, and reliable
feedback on how students are progressing so that students can become
more active participants in their learning and educators can receive the
diagnostic feedback necessary to customize instruction; and

8 (f) In adopting the new system of assessments, the state board of 9 education should take into account the feedback received from teachers, 10 parents, and students and ensure that the summative assessments, to the 11 extent they are included, and especially the interim assessments:

(I) Reliably and accurately gauge student knowledge and skill andcan be used to inform teaching and learning;

(II) Provide results that support analysis of yearly academicgrowth;

(III) Can be administered on-line or electronically, to the extent
practicable and economically feasible, with real-time turnaround of
results;

(IV) Allow multiple opportunities for students to take different
test versions within the same school year if necessary to support and
encourage student academic growth;

(V) Include a rich mix of testing items such as multiple-choice
questions; open-ended, constructed response questions; and on-line
simulations and reflect use of twenty-first-century learning skills;

(VI) Are significantly shorter in completion time than the
 statewide assessments administered pursuant to the Colorado student
 assessment program; and

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(VII) Are relevant to students, parents, and educators.

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(3) The general assembly further finds that:

3 (a) The new system of assessments, like the existing Colorado 4 student assessment program, will continue to place significant financial 5 burdens on local education providers as they struggle to comply with the 6 state and federal mandates imposed on them. Therefore, the department 7 of education must assume a greater role of support and guidance in 8 assisting local education providers to implement the new system of 9 assessments, including creating a resource bank of best practices and of 10 interim assessments from which, if it chooses to do so, a local education 11 provider may select the assessments that are most economical to 12 administer and best aligned with the local education provider's 13 curriculum.

(b) In addition, to help ease the financial burden on local
education providers, the department of education shall use only statewide
summative assessment results in the Colorado growth model and shall not
collect data concerning student performance on interim or formative
assessments.

(4) (a) It is the intent of the general assembly that the federal
government will provide sufficient moneys to pay the costs of complying
with the federal assessment mandates.

(b) It is further the intent of the general assembly that, rather than
investing in additional summative assessments beyond those federally
mandated, the state should more profitably use its limited resources to
support students and local education providers by:

26 (I) Improving the availability and quality of early childhood27 education;

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(II) Improving the availability and quality of student support
 systems, including school counselors, before- and after-school programs
 and resources, supplemental on-line programs, and technology;

4 (III) Providing greater access to educational opportunities for
5 students, including career and technical education programs, internships,
6 externships and mentoring programs in the community;

7 (IV) Improving the quality and availability of professional8 development for educators, including educational leadership training; and

9 (V) Directing resources into the classroom to improve students'
achievement of the twenty-first century learning skills, including
innovative and creative thinking, collaboration and communication skills,
critical-thinking and problem-solving skills, and character and leadership.
SECTION 2. 22-7-409 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
amended, and the said 22-7-409 is further amended BY THE ADDITION
OF THE FOLLOWING NEW SUBSECTIONS, to read:

16 22-7-409. Assessments. (1) (a) Beginning in the spring semester 17 1997, The department shall implement the Colorado student assessment 18 program under which the department shall administer statewide 19 assessments adopted by the board pursuant to section 22-7-406 in the first 20 priority areas of reading, writing, AND mathematics and science TO 21 STUDENTS ENROLLED IN GRADES THREE THROUGH EIGHT AND IN GRADE 22 TEN IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT THE STATE. THE DEPARTMENT 23 SHALL ALSO ADMINISTER STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS ADOPTED BY THE 24 BOARD PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-409 IN SCIENCE TO STUDENTS 25 ENROLLED IN GRADES FIVE, EIGHT, AND TEN IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS 26 THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

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(b) BEGINNING IN THE 2010-11 ACADEMIC YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT

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SHALL ADMINISTER THE POSTSECONDARY AND WORKFORCE PLANNING
 ASSESSMENT, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 22-7-1003 (13), SELECTED BY THE
 BOARD PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-1008 (2), TO STUDENTS ENROLLED IN
 NINTH GRADE.

(c) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS
SUBSECTION (1) TO THE CONTRARY, BEGINNING IN THE 2011-12 ACADEMIC
YEAR, IN LIEU OF ADMINISTERING THE TENTH-GRADE STATEWIDE
ASSESSMENTS IN READING, WRITING, MATHEMATICS, AND SCIENCE, THE
DEPARTMENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE POSTSECONDARY AND WORKFORCE
PREPARATION ASSESSMENT, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 22-7-1003 (14),
SELECTED BY THE BOARD PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-1008 (2).

12 (d) The department shall administer the English versions of the 13 state assessments and may administer any assessments adopted by the 14 board in languages other than English, as may be appropriate for students 15 whose dominant language is not English; except that any student who has 16 participated in the English language proficiency program, created 17 pursuant to section 22-24-104, for more than a total of three school years 18 shall be ineligible to take the assessments in a language other than 19 English. The statewide assessments shall be administered according to 20 the following implementation schedule:

(a) Beginning in the spring semester 1997, and each spring
 semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide
 assessment in reading and writing to all students enrolled in fourth grade
 in public schools throughout the state.

(b) Beginning in the spring semester 1998, and each spring
 semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide
 assessment in reading to all students enrolled in the third grade in public

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1 schools throughout the state.

2 (c) (I) Beginning in the fall semester 1999, the department shall
administer a statewide assessment in mathematics to all students enrolled
in the fifth grade in public schools throughout the state.

5 (II) Beginning in the spring semester 2001, and each spring 6 semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide 7 assessment in mathematics to all students enrolled in the fifth grade in 8 public schools throughout the state.

9 (d) Beginning in the spring semester 1999, and each spring 10 semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide 11 assessment in reading and writing to all students enrolled in the seventh 12 grade in public schools throughout the state.

(d.5) Beginning in the spring semester 2000, and each spring
 semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide
 assessment in mathematics and science to all students enrolled in the
 eighth grade in public schools throughout the state.

(e) Beginning in the spring semester 2001, and each spring
semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide
assessment in reading to all students enrolled in the fifth, sixth, eighth,
and ninth grades in public schools throughout the state and in reading,
writing, and mathematics to all students enrolled in the tenth grade in
public schools throughout the state.

(f) Beginning in the spring semester 2002, and each spring
semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide
assessment in writing to all students enrolled in the third, fifth, sixth,
eighth, and ninth grades in public schools throughout the state and in
mathematics to all students enrolled in the sixth, seventh, and ninth

1 grades in public schools throughout the state.

2 (g) (I) If sufficient moneys are received from the federal 3 government through the federal "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001", 4 Public Law 107-110, to pay for the development and administration of the 5 assessments, beginning in the spring semester 2006 at the latest, and each 6 spring semester thereafter, the department shall administer a statewide assessment first in mathematics to all students enrolled in the third and 7 8 fourth grades and in science to all students enrolled in the fifth and tenth 9 grades in public schools throughout the state.

(II) The assessments described in this paragraph (g) shall only be
 developed or administered to the extent that federal moneys are received
 to pay for such development and administration. It is the intent of the
 general assembly that no state moneys shall be used to develop or
 administer the assessments described in this paragraph (g).

(5) (a) NO LATER THAN JUNE 30, 2010, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
SUBMIT TO THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION A REQUEST FOR
MODIFICATION OF THE STATE PLAN, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 22-7-1003
(24), TO:

(I) REPLACE THE NINTH-GRADE STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS IN
READING, WRITING, AND MATHEMATICS WITH THE POSTSECONDARY AND
WORKFORCE PLANNING ASSESSMENT BEGINNING IN THE 2010-11
ACADEMIC YEAR; AND

(II) REPLACE THE TENTH-GRADE STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS IN
READING, WRITING, MATHEMATICS, AND SCIENCE WITH THE
POSTSECONDARY AND WORKFORCE PREPARATION ASSESSMENT BEGINNING
IN THE 2011-12 ACADEMIC YEAR.

27 (b) IN ADDITION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADJUST THE COLORADO

GROWTH MODEL CREATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-11-202 AS
 NECESSARY TO REFLECT REPLACEMENT OF THE NINTH-GRADE STATEWIDE
 ASSESSMENTS IN READING, WRITING, AND MATHEMATICS WITH THE
 POSTSECONDARY AND WORKFORCE PLANNING ASSESSMENT AND
 REPLACEMENT OF THE TENTH-GRADE STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS IN
 READING, WRITING. MATHEMATICS, AND SCIENCE WITH THE
 POSTSECONDARY AND WORKFORCE PREPARATION ASSESSMENT.

8 (6) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT THE 9 MONEYS SAVED BY DISCONTINUING THE NINTH-GRADE STATEWIDE 10 ASSESSMENTS IN READING, WRITING, AND MATHEMATICS SHALL BE 11 APPROPRIATED TO FUND ADMINISTRATION OF THE POSTSECONDARY AND 12 WORKFORCE PLANNING ASSESSMENT AND THE POSTSECONDARY AND 13 WORKFORCE PREPARATION ASSESSMENT.

 amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:

(1.5) (d) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY 16 17 PROVISION OF THIS PARAGRAPH (1.5) TO THE CONTRARY, BEGINNING IN 18 THE 2012-13 ACADEMIC YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CEASE TO 19 ADMINISTER THE CURRICULUM-BASED, ACHIEVEMENT COLLEGE ENTRANCE 20 EXAM, AND SHALL ADMINISTER THE POSTSECONDARY AND WORKFORCE 21 READINESS ASSESSMENTS ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD AND THE 22 COMMISSION PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-1008 TO STUDENTS ENROLLED 23 IN THE ELEVENTH GRADE.

7 (7.5) "FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT" MEANS A SET OF ASSESSMENT
8 QUESTIONS, TOOLS, AND PROCESSES THAT ARE EMBEDDED IN INSTRUCTION
9 AND USED BY TEACHERS AND STUDENTS TO PROVIDE TIMELY FEEDBACK
10 FOR PURPOSES OF ADJUSTING INSTRUCTION TO IMPROVE LEARNING.

11 (8.5) "INTERIM ASSESSMENT" MEANS AN ASSESSMENT THAT IS
12 GIVEN AT REGULAR AND SPECIFIED INTERVALS THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL
13 YEAR, IS DESIGNED TO EVALUATE STUDENTS' KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS
14 RELATIVE TO A SPECIFIC SET OF ACADEMIC STANDARDS, AND PRODUCES
15 RESULTS THAT CAN BE AGGREGATED TO INFORM TEACHERS AND

18 (25) "SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT" MEANS AN ASSESSMENT THAT IS

20 TIME TO MEASURE A STUDENT'S PROFICIENCY IN RELATION TO A SPECIFIC
21 SET OF ACADEMIC STANDARDS.

SECTION 6. 22-7-1006, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended
to read:

 25 education - aligned assessments - adoption - revisions. (1) (a) On or
 26 before December 15, 2010, The state board shall adopt a system of
 27 assessments that are aligned with the preschool through elementary and

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1 secondary education standards and are designed to measure students' 2 levels of attainment of the standards and to longitudinally measure 3 students' academic progress toward attaining the standards and toward 4 attaining postsecondary and workforce readiness. 20 (1.5) (a) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUPPORT LOCAL EDUCATION 21 PROVIDERS IN IMPLEMENTING THE SYSTEM OF ASSESSMENTS BY WORKING 22 WITH LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDERS AND THE ASSESSMENT STAKEHOLDER 23 COMMITTEE TO COMPILE AND MAINTAIN A RESOURCE BANK OF AVAILABLE 24 INTERIM ASSESSMENTS, OTHER EXISTING ASSESSMENT TOOLS, TESTING 25 STRATEGIES, RUBRICS, AND BEST PRACTICES WITH REGARD TO 26 ADMINISTERING AND APPLYING THE RESULTS OF INTERIM ASSESSMENTS. 27 IN COMPILING THE RESOURCE BANK, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE

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1 THAT THE ASSESSMENTS INCLUDED MEET THE PARAMETERS ESTABLISHED 2 BY THE STATE BOARD PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (a) OF SUBSECTION (1) OF 3 THIS SECTION AND HAVE BEEN TESTED AND PROVEN TO BE EFFECTIVE IN 4 MEASURING STUDENT ACADEMIC GROWTH. - 10 (VIII) INCLUDE A VARIETY OF ASSESSMENT TYPES, INCLUDING BUT
 11 NOT LIMITED TO MULTIPLE-CHOICE QUESTIONS, OPEN-ENDED

13 (b) In adopting a system of assessments, the state board shall give 14 consideration to the use of ENSURE THAT THE SYSTEM IS DESIGNED TO 15 REQUIRE STUDENTS TO DEMONSTRATE AND APPLY THE SKILLS LISTED IN 16 SECTION 22-7-1005 (3) (e) THROUGH THE USE OF INTERIM AND 17 SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENTS AND THROUGH THE USE OF authentic 18 assessment methods, such as portfolios, PERFORMANCE TASKS, projects, 19 EXHIBITIONS, and performances. so long as THE STATE BOARD SHALL 20 FURTHER ENSURE THAT the assessment methods are valid and reliable, 21 employ standard scoring criteria, and align with the preschool through 22 elementary and secondary education standards, AND GIVE EACH LOCAL 23 EDUCATION PROVIDER FLEXIBILITY IN DESIGNING OR ADOPTING AND 24 IMPLEMENTING ITS SPECIFIC FORMATIVE AND INTERIM ASSESSMENTS. THE 25 STATE BOARD SHALL DESIGN THE SYSTEM OF ASSESSMENTS TO ENSURE 26 THAT THE ASSESSMENTS USED STATEWIDE AND BY INDIVIDUAL LOCAL 27 EDUCATION PROVIDERS ARE MEANINGFUL AND RELEVANT AND PROVIDE TO

STUDENTS, EDUCATORS, AND PARENTS HELPFUL, TIMELY INFORMATION.
