A BILL FOR AN ACT 101 CONCERNING AUTHORIZATION TO PLACE VOLUNTARILY AN IDENTIFIER 102 OF A BRANCH OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES ON 103 CERTAIN IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS ISSUED BY THE 104 DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill authorizes a service member or veteran to request a branch of armed service identifier on a driver's license or identification card. The

fee for voluntarily having an armed service identifier on a driver's license or identification card is \$15, a portion of which is used to offset the cost of including armed service identifiers on driver's licenses and identification cards, and the remainder is transmitted to the highway users tax fund.
