A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A CENTRAL ON-LINE REGISTRY OF MEDICAL ORDERS FOR
102 SCOPE OF TREATMENT FORMS.

Bill Summary

Hospice and Palliative Care in Colorado. The bill requires the department of public health and environment (department) to create and maintain an on-line registry of medical orders for scope of treatment forms (registry). The bill also creates the medical forms on-line registry cash fund (fund) and authorizes the department to solicit and accept gifts,

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** Part 12 of article 1 of title 25, Colorado Revised
3 Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to
4 read:

5 **25-1-1204. On-line exchange of advanced directives forms**
6 **permitted.** A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ENTITY, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED
7 TO A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION, THAT FACILITATES THE EXCHANGE OF
8 HEALTH INFORMATION AMONG EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS,
9 DOCTORS, HOSPITALS, NURSING HOMES, PHARMACIES, HOME HEALTH
10 AGENCIES, HEALTH PLANS, AND LOCAL HEALTH INFORMATION AGENCIES
11 THROUGH THE USE OF HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY MAY
12 FACILITATE THE VOLUNTARY, SECURE, AND CONFIDENTIAL EXCHANGE OF
13 FORMS CONTAINING ADVANCED DIRECTIVES REGARDING A PERSON'S
14 ACCEPTANCE OR REJECTION OF LIFE-SUSTAINING MEDICAL OR SURGICAL
15 TREATMENT.

16 **SECTION 2.** 25-1.5-101 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
17 amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:

18 **25-1.5-101. Powers and duties of department.** (1) The
19 department has, in addition to all other powers and duties imposed upon
20 it by law, the powers and duties provided in this section as follows:

21 (bb) TO INCLUDE ON ITS PUBLIC WEB SITE HOME PAGE A LINK TO
22 FORMS CONTAINING ADVANCED DIRECTIVES REGARDING A PERSON'S
23 ACCEPTANCE OR REJECTION OF LIFE-SUSTAINING MEDICAL OR SURGICAL
24 TREATMENT, WHICH FORMS ARE AVAILABLE TO BE DOWNLOADED
25 ELECTRONICALLY.

1 **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
2 shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
3 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
4 11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a
5 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
6 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
7 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect
8 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
9 November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official
10 declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
