## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING AUTHORIZATION FOR AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
 102 EDUCATION TO APPLY FOR STIPENDS FROM THE COLLEGE
 103 OPPORTUNITY FUND.

## **Bill Summary**

The bill allows an institution of higher education to apply for stipends from the college opportunity fund on behalf of an admitted student using the information in the student's admission application if the student agrees. 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. 23-18-202 (5) (a), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3 amended to read:

4 College opportunity fund - appropriations -23-18-202. 5 payment of stipends - reimbursement. (5) (a) (I) After an 6 undergraduate student has applied for the program, been approved for the 7 program, and enrolled in a state or participating private institution of 8 higher education, the institution shall request that the Colorado student 9 loan program make a stipend payment from the college opportunity fund 10 to the institution on behalf of the eligible undergraduate student. A 11 payment by the Colorado student loan program to an institution of higher 12 education from the college opportunity fund shall not be subject to the 13 assessment of a transaction fee pursuant to section 24-36-120, C.R.S. 14 The stipend payment shall be paid to the institution upon receipt by the 15 institution of the eligible undergraduate student's authorization. The 16 amount of the stipend paid on behalf of an eligible undergraduate student 17 shall be applied against the student's total in-state tuition.

THIS PARAGRAPH (a) TO THE CONTRARY, AN INSTITUTION, WITH A
STUDENT'S PERMISSION, MAY APPLY FOR THE PROGRAM ON THE STUDENT'S
BEHALF USING THE INFORMATION IN THE STUDENT'S ADMISSION
APPLICATION AFTER THE STUDENT HAS BEEN ENROLLED IN THE
INSTITUTION.
