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A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK SYSTEM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill eliminates statutory language requiring the Colorado bureau of investigation (CBI) to deny a transfer of a firearm if information from the national instant criminal background check system (NICS) indicates that (1) the prospective transferee has been arrested for or charged with a crime for which the prospective transferee, if convicted,

would be prohibited under state or federal law from purchasing, receiving, or possessing a firearm; and (2) either there has been no final disposition of the case or the final disposition is not noted in the other databases. This language is replaced by new language that requires the CBI to deny a transfer of a firearm if information from the NICS indicates that (1) the prospective transferee has been arrested for or charged with a crime for which the prospective transferee, if convicted, would be prohibited under state or federal law from purchasing, receiving, or possessing a firearm; and (2) the prospective transferee either is released on bond or has been issued a summons to appear in court for resolution of the arrest or charge.
