- 2 SECTION 1. 19-2-921, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended
 3 BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:
- 4 19-2-921. Commitment to department of human services.
 5 (11) IF A JUVENILE WHO IS COMMITTED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN
 6 SERVICES ESCAPES FROM A FACILITY OPERATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR
 7 A FACILITY WITH WHICH THE DEPARTMENT CONTRACTS, THE DEPARTMENT
 8 SHALL NOT COUNT THE TIME THE JUVENILE IS ON ESCAPE STATUS TOWARD
 9 COMPLETION OF THE JUVENILE'S COMMITMENT.
 10 SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
- determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediatepreservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
