# A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### 101 CONCERNING THE ELIMINATION OF CERTAIN WITNESS FEES, AND

102 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR.

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill eliminates the daily fee, ranging from \$1.50 to \$2.50, that a witness receives for attending court other than municipal, court commissioner, or magistrate courts. The bill eliminates the daily fee, ranging from .50 cents to \$2.00, that a witness receives for attending municipal court.

The bill eliminates the fee that a witness receives for attending a coroner's inquest.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** 13-33-102 (1), (2), (3), (4), and (6), Colorado 3 Revised Statutes, are amended to read: 4 13-33-102. Fees of witnesses. (1) Witnesses shall receive for 5 attending in any court of record, except municipal courts, court 6 commissioner, or magistrate, the following fees: In counties of the first 7 class, one dollar and fifty cents per day; second class, two dollars per day; 8 third class, two dollars per day; fourth class, two dollars and fifty cents 9 per day; fifth class, two dollars and fifty cents per day. 10 (2) For attending before a municipal court, witnesses shall receive 11 the following fees: In counties of the first class, fifty cents per day; 12 second class, seventy-five cents per day; third class, one dollar per day; 13 fourth class, two dollars per day; fifth class, two dollars per day; except 14 that the governing body of a municipality may, by resolution or 15 ordinance, set higher or lower fees for attending its municipal court. 16 For attending inquest over dead body before coroner, (3)17 witnesses shall receive the same fees as provided in subsection (2) of this 18 section for witnesses attending before a municipal court, to be paid out of 19 the county treasury. 20 (4) Witnesses in courts of record called to testify only to an 21 opinion founded on special study or experience in any branch of science 22 or to make scientific or professional examinations and state the result 23 thereof shall receive additional compensation, to be fixed by the court, 24 with reference to the value of the time employed and the degree of

25 learning or skill required.

(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (1) to (5) (4)
 AND (5) of this section, the witness fee specified in this section shall not
 be paid to any witness who at the time of testifying is in the legal custody
 of any state or federal agency or any local law enforcement agency and
 whose transportation to court is provided at government expense.

6 SECTION 2. Repeal. 1-1-113 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes,
7 is repealed as follows:

8 **1-1-113.** Neglect of duty and wrongful acts - procedures for 9 adjudication of controversies - review by supreme court. (2) The 10 petitioner shall be required to deposit in court the statutory witness fees 11 pursuant to section 13-33-102, C.R.S., for each person cited or summoned 12 into court as a party or a witness, to be paid to the party or witness if the 13 charge is not sustained. The money so deposited shall be returned to the 14 party depositing it if any of the charges are sustained.

SECTION 3. Appropriation - adjustments to the 2010 long
bill. For the implementation of this act, the general fund appropriation
made in the annual general appropriation act for the fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2010, to the judicial department, trial courts, for district attorney
mandated costs, is decreased by seventeen thousand three hundred dollars
(\$17,300).

SECTION 4. Specified effective date - applicability. This act
 shall take effect July 1, 2010, and shall apply to witnesses appearing on
 or after said date.

SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
