
A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 101 CONCERNING A REDUCTION IN THE AMOUNT OF THE PENALTY FOR
- 102 LATE VEHICLE REGISTRATION OF A VEHICLE WITHOUT MOTIVE
- 103 **POWER THAT WEIGHS TWO THOUSAND POUNDS OR LESS.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Effective July 1, 2010, the bill reduces the penalty for late registration of a vehicle without motive power that weighs 2,000 pounds or less from \$25 per month up to \$100 to \$10.





1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. 42-3-112, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended
3 BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

4 42-3-112. Failure to pay tax penalty. 5 (1.5) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS 6 SECTION, ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2010, THE AMOUNT OF THE LATE FEE 7 PAYABLE BY THE OWNER OF A VEHICLE WITHOUT MOTIVE POWER THAT 8 WEIGHS TWO THOUSAND POUNDS OR LESS, THAT IS SUBJECT TO TAXATION 9 UNDER THIS ARTICLE, AND THAT IS NOT REGISTERED WHEN REQUIRED BY 10 LAW SHALL BE TEN DOLLARS. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (1.5), 11 THE WEIGHT OF A TRAILER OF ANY KIND IS THE EMPTY WEIGHT.

SECTION 2. Specified effective date - applicability. This act
 shall take effect July 1, 2010, and shall apply to late fees accrued on or
 after said date.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
