Summary of Legislation

The bill requires that identification used for election-related purposes include a photograph of the individual. The bill removes several forms of identification that do not have a photograph of the individual from the list of acceptable identification.

State Expenditures

The Department of State will have one-time costs of \$25,000 in FY 2010-11 to revise, print, and distribute new voter registration forms and other election-related materials. The department is required to provide these forms to county clerks, voter registration drives, and other designated agencies that provide for voter registration under the National Voter Registration Act. With an effective date in the current fiscal year, the department will replace current supplies of voter registration forms statewide. These costs will be paid from the Department of State Cash Fund.

Local Government Impact

The bill will increase the workload of county clerks. The offices of county clerks will be required to update county publications and procedures to conform with the new requirements.

State Appropriations

The Department of State requires a cash funds appropriation of \$25,000 for FY 2010-11 from the Department of State Cash Fund.
