Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 01/25/11 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note Was Prepared (Amended by the House Transportation Committee 01/26/11)

The House Transportation Committee Report dated January 26, 2011 added a provision that prohibits a holder of an agricultural youth license or instruction permit who is younger than 16 years of age to drive on a limited access highway with a posted speed limit greater than 65 miles per hour. This amendment does not have a fiscal impact. Legislative Council Staff agrees with the assessment of the fiscal impact.

Amendments/Appropriation Status

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause. Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision appropriating, for FY 2011-12, \$207,152 cash funds from the Licensing Services Cash Fund to the Department of Revenue. Of that amount, \$107,152 is appropriated to the information technology division and is further reappropriated to the Governor - Lieutenant Governor - State Planning and Budgeting, Office of Information Technology for programming services provided to the Department of Revenue, and \$100,000 is appropriated to the Division of Motor Vehicles, Driver and Vehicle Services for work related to preparing documents, accounting, creating an applicant record, and other duties.
