	HB11-1049 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

7	<b>18-5-902. Identity theft.</b> (1) A person commits identity theft if
8	he or she KNOWINGLY:
9	(a) Knowingly Uses the personal identifying information,
10	financial identifying information, or A financial device of another without
11	permission or lawful authority, with the intent to obtain cash, credit,
12	property, services, or any other thing of value or to make a financial
13	payment, IF THE INFORMATION OR DEVICE IS THAT OF ANOTHER;
14 15	(b) Knowingly Possesses the personal identifying information,
16	financial identifying information, or A financial device of another without permission or lawful authority, with the intent to use or to aid or permit
17	some other person to use such information or device to obtain cash,
18	credit, property, services, or any other thing of value or to make a
19	financial payment, IF THE INFORMATION OR DEVICE IS THAT OF ANOTHER;
20	(c) With the intent to defraud, Falsely makes, completes, alters, or
21	utters a written instrument or financial device containing any personal
22	identifying information or financial identifying information of another,
23	WITH THE INTENT TO DEFRAUD, IF THE INFORMATION OR DEVICE IS THAT
24	OF ANOTHER;

- (d) Knowingly Possesses the personal identifying information or financial identifying information of another without permission or lawful authority, WITH THE INTENT to use THE INFORMATION in applying for or completing an application for a financial device or other extension of credit, IF THE INFORMATION IS THAT OF ANOTHER; OR
- (e) Knowingly Uses or possesses the personal identifying information of another without permission or lawful authority, with the intent to USE THE INFORMATION TO obtain a government-issued document, or IF THE INFORMATION IS THAT OF ANOTHER.
- (1.5) TO COMMIT IDENTITY THEFT AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, A PERSON NEED NOT BE AWARE THAT THE PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION, FINANCIAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION, OR FINANCIAL DEVICE IS THAT OF ANOTHER. THIS ELEMENT IS ONE OF STRICT LIABILITY.
- **SECTION 2.** 18-5-113 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended, and the said 18-5-113 is further amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION, to read:
- **18-5-113. Criminal impersonation.** (1) A person commits criminal impersonation if he OR SHE knowingly:
- (a) Assumes a false or fictitious identity or LEGAL capacity, and in such identity or capacity he OR SHE:
- (a) (I) Marries, or pretends to marry, or to sustain the marriage relation toward another without the connivance of the latter; or
- (b) (II) Becomes bail or surety for a party in an action or proceeding, civil or criminal, before a court or officer authorized to take the bail or surety; or
- (c) (III) Confesses a judgment, or subscribes, verifies, publishes, acknowledges, or proves a written instrument which by law may be recorded, with the intent that the same may be delivered as true; or
- (b) ASSUMES A FALSE OR FICTITIOUS IDENTITY OR CAPACITY, LEGAL OR OTHER, AND IN SUCH IDENTITY OR CAPACITY HE OR SHE:
- (d) (I) Does PERFORMS an act which THAT, if done by the person falsely impersonated, might subject such person to an action or special proceeding, civil or criminal, or to liability, charge, forfeiture, or penalty; or
- (e) (II) Does PERFORMS any other act with intent to unlawfully gain a benefit for himself, HERSELF, or another or to injure or defraud another.
- 39 (3) FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, USING
  40 FALSE OR FICTITIOUS PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION, AS DEFINED
  41 IN SECTION 18-5-901 (13), SHALL CONSTITUTE THE ASSUMPTION OF A
  42 FALSE OR FICTITIOUS IDENTITY OR CAPACITY.

SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 10, 2011, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2011); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2012 and shall take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor."

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
