A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING EQUALIZING THE AMOUNT OF THE COLORADO OPPORTUNITY FUND STIPEND FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND STUDENTS ATTENDING PARTICIPATING PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, an eligible undergraduate student who attends

a private institution of higher education that participates in the Colorado opportunity fund program may receive 50% of the stipend amount. Under the bill, beginning in the 2011-12 fiscal year, the eligible undergraduate student attending a participating private institution of higher education may receive the full amount of the stipend. Increasing the stipend amount for students at participating private institutions of higher education to equal the stipend for students at state institutions of higher education shall not increase the total amount appropriated to fund the stipends.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** 23-18-202 (2) (b) and (2) (e), Colorado Revised 3 Statutes, are amended to read: 4 23-18-202. College opportunity fund - appropriations -5 payment of stipends - reimbursement - repeal. (2) (b) For the state 6 fiscal year commencing July 1, 2005, and for state fiscal years thereafter, 7 for an eligible undergraduate student attending a state institution of higher 8 education, the specified amount of the stipend per credit hour shall be an 9 amount set annually by the general assembly, which in no case shall 10 exceed the student's total in-state tuition. The value of the per credit hour 11 stipend shall be the same for each eligible undergraduate student, 12 regardless of the state institution of higher education that the student 13 attends. The student shall be responsible for paying the student's share of 14 total in-state tuition, if any. 15 (2) (e) (I) FOR FISCAL YEARS BEGINNING PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2011, 16 an eligible undergraduate student who attends a participating private 17 institution of higher education may receive financial assistance under this 18 part 2 in the amount of fifty percent of the stipend amount; except that the 19 amount of the stipend under this paragraph (e) SUBPARAGRAPH (I) may 20 increase in proportion to the percent of unfunded enrollment growth that 21 is appropriated to the governing boards pursuant to section 23-5-129 (8).

9	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
10	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
