A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING FUNDING FOR PUBLIC <u>EDUCATION.</u>**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

In the bill, the general assembly recognizes the preeminent importance of funding public education and the need to prioritize funding for public education.

The bill creates the knowledge-based economy fund (fund) that will consist of an amount of money equal to the amount by which the state general fund beginning balance for the 2011-12 fiscal year, as estimated in December 2011, exceeds the estimate of the beginning state general fund balance in March 2011, moneys received as a result of certain audits, and any additional moneys the general assembly may appropriate to the fund. The moneys credited to the fund as of January 1, 2012, are appropriated to the department of education for distribution to school districts and institute charter schools through a reduction in the state budget stabilization factor. Any moneys credited to the fund after January 1, 2012, but prior to June 30, 2012, may be used as supplemental appropriations to the department of education for school districts and charter schools. The fund repeals on July 1, 2012.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly

4	(a) In difficult economic times, the general assembly must be
5	exceptionally vigilant in prioritizing the appropriation of public moneys
6	to fund those services that most directly influence the success of the state
7	and its citizens;
8	(b) Of all of the services provided by state and local government,
9	public education exercises the most widespread, direct influence on the
10	citizens of the state, ensuring them a wider range of opportunities and a
11	greater likelihood of economic success;
12	(c) In providing a well-educated citizenry, a well-funded, effective
13	public education system also increases the likelihood that the state will
14	enjoy a strong economy that attracts investment by businesses and
15	industries that further improve the standard of living for the people of the
16	state; and
17	(d) During periods of budgetary reductions, it is crucial that the
18	state maintains funding for public education to the greatest extent
19	possible. In considering funding for services and programs other than
20	education, the general assembly should specifically balance the necessity

3	(2) The general assembly finds, therefore, that it is in the best
4	interests of the state to appropriate to the state public school fund created
5	in section 22-54-114, Colorado Revised Statutes, and to the state

7	constitution the amount of the general fund surplus that exceeds the
8	amount required for reserves for the 2010-11 fiscal year and any
