# <u>Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 02/15/11 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal</u> <u>Note Was Prepared (Amended by the House Transportation Committee 02/16/11)</u>

The House Transportation Committee Report dated February 16, 2011, provides an exception to the rule that an owner of a vehicle return the license plate to the Department of Revenue when the authorization to use that vehicle as a taxicab has been terminated. The exception applies if the person who owns the vehicle subsequently obtains authorization, either directly or as an agent, to operate the vehicle as a taxicab, then the vehicle owner may keep and display the taxicab license plate.

JBC Staff and Legislative Council Staff agree that this amendment does not change the fiscal impact of the bill.

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#### **Amendments/Appropriation Status**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause. Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating:

- 1. \$8,880 cash funds from the Colorado State Titling and Registration (CSTAR) Account of the Highway Users Tax Fund to the Department of Revenue, Information Technology Division for FY 2011-12 for reprogramming required to the CSTAR System. These funds are further reappropriated to the Governor Lieutenant Governor State Planning and Budgeting, Office of Information Technology for FY 2011-12 for programming services provided to the Department of Revenue related to the implementation of this bill.
- 2. \$2,072 cash funds from the Licensing Services Cash Fund to the Department of Revenue, Information Technology Division for FY 2011-12 for reprogramming the driver's license computer system. These funds are further reappropriated to the Governor Lieutenant Governor State Planning and Budgeting, Office of Information Technology for FY 2011-12 for programming services provided to the Department of Revenue related to the implementation of this bill.

3. \$14,800 cash funds from the License Plate Cash Fund to the Department of Revenue, Division of Motor Vehicles, for FY 2011-12 for the purchase of license plates from the Department of Corrections, Correctional Industries.
