A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE IMPOSITION OF A FEE ON MOVIE TICKETS SOLD IN**
102 **THE STATE FOR PURPOSES OF FUNDING THE**
103 **PERFORMANCE-BASED INCENTIVE PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY**

Bill Summary

Commencing on July 1, 2011, the bill imposes a fee of 10 cents on each movie ticket sold in the state. The bill requires movie ticket vendors

to remit the fee revenue in conjunction with the vendor's remittance of sales tax revenue and requires the department of revenue to credit the fee revenue to the creative industries cash fund. The movie ticket fee revenue is to be used by the Colorado office of film, television, and media to fund the performance-based incentive program for film production in Colorado.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** Part 3 of article 48.5 of title 24, Colorado Revised
3 Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to
4 read:

5 **24-48.5-311.5. Film, television, and media - funding for**
6 **performance-based incentive.** ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2011, ALL MOVIE
7 TICKET VENDORS MAY COLLECT ANY GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS MADE
8 BY A PERSON TO FUND PERFORMANCE-BASED INCENTIVES FOR FILM
9 PRODUCTION IN COLORADO AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 24-48.5-311. THE
10 MOVIE TICKET VENDOR SHALL COLLECT ANY GIFTS, GRANTS, AND
11 DONATIONS RECEIVED UNTIL THE TOTAL AMOUNT COLLECTED EQUALS A
12 MINIMUM OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS AND SHALL THEN TRANSMIT THE
13 TOTAL AMOUNT COLLECTED TO THE STATE TREASURER AS FREQUENTLY AS
14 NEEDED, BUT NO LESS THAN ONCE A YEAR. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL
15 CREDIT THE MONEY RECEIVED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION TO THE
16 CREATIVE INDUSTRIES CASH FUND CREATED IN SECTION 24-48.5-301 AND
17 SHALL BE USED BY THE OFFICE FOR THE PERFORMANCE-BASED INCENTIVES
18 FOR FILM PRODUCTION IN COLORADO AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION
19 24-48.5-311.

20 **SECTION 2.** The introductory portion to 24-48.5-309, Colorado
21 Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

22 **24-48.5-309. Film, television, and media - definitions.** As used
