Summary of Legislation

This bill repeals the requirement for the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) to annually obtain certain information concerning local municipalities with populations less than 1,000. Under current law, DOLA is required to obtain the names of the mayor, mayor pro tem, treasurer and clerk of the municipality, the date of the last election and a certificate that the municipality continues to operate under its incorporation. This bill repeals this requirement.

State Expenditures

This bill reduces state expenditures by less than \$1,000 in FY 2011-12 and beyond. These cost savings are associated with certified postage expenditures and a minimal level of staff time needed to register the information in DOLA's database.

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Local Government Impact

The 128 municipalities affected by this bill will have reduced costs related to postage and staff time needed to respond to DOLA's request. These costs are expected to be less than \$1,000 for all municipalities combined.
