**Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 03/01/11 Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note Was Prepared (Amended by the Senate Appropriations Committee 04/15/11 and by the House Finance Committee 05/04/11)**

The Senate Appropriations Committee Report dated April 15, 2011 added language that permitted the appropriation of moneys in the Debt Collection Fund to the Department of Revenue for FY 2011-12 and added an appropriation clause (see the "Amendments/Appropriation Status" section below for details of the appropriation).

The House Finance Committee Report dated May 4, 2011 made changes to the effective date for certain provisions of the bill, delaying them to January 1, 2012, which will give the Department of Revenue and the Statewide Internet Portal Authority time to make the necessary changes to state databases. In addition, the Finance Committee report increased the fee added to the debt owed to the State to \$40 and stipulated that at least \$30 of that amount shall be retained by the licensee collecting the debt.

JBC Staff and Legislative Council Staff agree that these changes to the bill do not affect State revenues and expenditures.

**Amendments/Appropriation Status**

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides an appropriation of \$94,600 cash funds from the Debt Collection Fund in FY 2011-12 to the Department of Revenue, Information Technology Division for programming to modify the Gambling Intercept Payment Application (GIPA) system to check additional databases for funds owed to Central Collections in the Department of Personnel and Administration. The programming will be performed by the Statewide Internet Portal Authority, which maintains the GIPA.
