A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE REPEAL OF REQUIRED REGISTRATION OF PERSONS WHO WORK ON FIRE SUPPRESSION SYSTEMS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. In 2010, the general assembly passed House Bill 10-1241 concerning the required registration for persons who work on fire suppression systems, which is to take effect July 1, 2011. This bill reverses the statutory changes made by House Bill 10-1241. Specifically, the bill repeals the prohibition against a person acting or advertising as a

sprinkler fitter unless the person has registered with the state fire suppression administrator. The bill also repeals requirements that must be fulfilled prior to registration, including:

- ! Demonstration that a sprinkler fitter has successfully completed a sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program;
- ! Completion of an application for reciprocity;
- ! Performance of at least 8,000 hours of documented practical work experience on fire suppression systems; and
- ! Demonstration of competency as a sprinkler fitter as determined by the administrator.

The bill also repeals the requirements that a sprinkler fitter complete continuing education and repeals the annual renewal of registration and the required successful completion of a revised examination in the years that the fire and building codes are revised.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Repeal. 24-33.5-1202 (13.3) and (13.7), Colorado

Revised Statutes, as they will become effective July 1, 2011, are repealed

4 as follows:

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24-33.5-1202. Definitions. As used in this part 12, unless the context otherwise requires:

(13.3) "Sprinkler fitter" means a person other than an apprentice who is registered with the administrator and who installs fire suppression systems. "Sprinkler fitter" does not include a person who performs maintenance and repair on fire suppression systems as a part of his or her employment. A sprinkler fitter does not include a person who performs work exclusively on cross-connection control devices or a person who performs work exclusively on an underground system. "Sprinkler fitter" does not include a person performing work on his or her own home.

(13.7) "Sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program" means an apprenticeship training program that is registered with either the office of apprenticeship training, employer and labor services in the employment

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	and training administration in the United States department of labor or a

	CFR 29.1 et seq., or other similar apprentice program approved by the
	administrator, and consists of a minimum of eight thousand hours of
	documented practical work experience on fire suppression systems,

	including classroom or shop instruction, in the sprinkler fitter trade.
	SECTION 2. Repeal. 24-33.5-1206.7, Colorado Revised
,	Statutes, as it will become effective July 1, 2011, is repealed as follows:

11	annually. The administrator shall renew, for a period of one year, a
12	sprinkler fitter registration upon receipt of a completed renewa
13	application and a renewal fee as determined by the administrator. In
14	years that the fire and safety code is revised, a sprinkler fitter shall also
15	successfully complete a revised examination in order to renew his or he
16	registration.
17	(6) The administrator may promulgate rules as necessary for the
18	implementation of this section.
19	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds

21	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
