Department of Corrections, Institutions, Mental Health Subprogram -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Department of Corrections work with the Mentally Ill Task Force to develop a plan for the implementation and ongoing evaluation of the mental health unit at Colorado State Penitentiary (CSP). It is further the intent of the General Assembly that the Department of Corrections submit a report to the House Judiciary Committee and the Senate Judiciary Committee by January 31, 2011, detailing the progress related to the mental health unit at CSP.

Department of Corrections, Institutions, Mental Health Subprogram -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Department of Corrections submit a plan to the House Judiciary Committee and the Senate Judiciary Committee before offenders with mental illness (OMIs) are placed in the beds at Colorado State Penitentiary (CSP) being converted for use by OMIs. Without limiting the scope of the report, the report shall include, at a minimum, plans in the following areas: (1) the basic purpose of the OMI beds at CSP in terms of the role those beds serve relative to the offender's mental health status; (2) the criteria the DOC will use to place offenders in the beds; (3) the services that will be provided to the offenders; (4) the classification levels that will be used
