## **Bill Summary**

In order to ensure the security of the secretary of state's on-line business filing system, the secretary is directed to implement a password-protected system for any filings, updates, or other filing requirements under title 7, Colorado Revised Statutes. 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 **SECTION 1.** 24-21-111 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is 3 amended to read:

24-21-111. Electronic filing - authority - electronic access passwords - rules. (1) (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
contrary, the secretary of state may require any filing to be made by
electronic means as determined by the secretary of state.

8 (b) IN ORDER TO ENSURE THE SECURITY OF THE SECRETARY OF 9 STATE'S ON-LINE BUSINESS FILING SYSTEM, THE SECRETARY SHALL 10 IMPLEMENT, UNDER SUCH CONDITIONS AS THE SECRETARY MAY 11 DETERMINE, A PASSWORD-PROTECTED SYSTEM FOR AND TAKE 12 APPROPRIATE ACTIONS TO ADDRESS FRAUDULENT ACTIVITIES AGAINST 13 ANY FILINGS, UPDATES, OR OTHER FILING REQUIREMENTS UNDER TITLE 7, 14 C.R.S.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
