The bill authorizes the public utilities commission to adopt rules creating an exemption from tiered electricity rate plans based on a customer's medical condition.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** Article 3 of title 40, Colorado Revised Statutes, is  
3 amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to read:

4           **40-3-103.5. Medical exemption - tiered electricity rates - rules.**  
5 THE COMMISSION MAY ADOPT RULES CREATING AN EXEMPTION FROM ANY  
6 TIERED ELECTRICITY RATE PLAN BASED ON A CUSTOMER'S MEDICAL  
7 CONDITION OR USE OF AN ESSENTIAL LIFE SUPPORT DEVICE.

8           **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
9 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
10 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
