#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE USE OF A VIDEO DISPLAY IN A MOTOR VEHICLE THAT
102 IS BEING OPERATED ON A ROADWAY.

## **Bill Summary**

Currently, it is illegal to have a screen that receives a television broadcast at any point forward of the driver's seat or visible to the driver. The bill allows the screen to be forward of the driver's seat so long as visual entertainment is not visible to the driver and clarifies that it is the display of video programming, not the reception of television, that triggers the prohibition.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-201, **amend** (3) 3 as follows: 4 42-4-201. Obstruction of view or driving mechanism -5 **hazardous situation.** (3) No A person shall NOT drive any A motor 6 vehicle equipped with any television viewer, screen, or other means of 7 visually receiving a television broadcast which is located in the motor 8 vehicle at any point forward of the back of the driver's seat or which is 9 A VIDEO DISPLAY visible to the driver while operating the motor vehicle 10 The provisions of IS IN MOTION. This subsection (3) shall not be 11 interpreted to DOES NOT prohibit the usage of any A computer, data 12 terminal, or other similar device in a motor vehicle SO LONG AS THE 13 COMPUTER, DATA TERMINAL, OR OTHER SIMILAR DEVICE IS NOT USED TO 14 DISPLAY VISUAL ENTERTAINMENT TO THE DRIVER WHILE THE MOTOR 15 VEHICLE IS IN MOTION. 16 **SECTION 2.** Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect 17 July 1, 2012, and applies to offenses committed on or after said date. 18 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, 19 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 20 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
