Summary of Legislation

This bill permits the executive director of the Department of Public Safety to appoint a deputy executive director for the department to act with the same powers, duties, and responsibilities as the executive director in the executive director's absence. It designates the deputy executive director and the director of the Division of Criminal Justice as peace officers.

State Revenue and Expenditures

To the extent that the two Department of Public Safety officials addressed by the bill choose to apply for Peace Officer Standards and Training Board certification, workload could increase. Currently, applicants must pay \$125 to the Attorney General's Office to take the certification exam. The fiscal note assumes that the two individuals involved will not seek certification by the Peace Officer Standards and Training Board, but if they do so in the future, the fiscal impact to the state will be minimal.
