Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 02/22/12 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note Was Prepared (Amended by the House Transportation Committee 02/23/12)

The House Transportation Committee Report dated February 23, 2012 amended the bill to include veterans of Operation Desert Shield among those eligible to purchase the license plate. Operation Desert Shield was the precursor to Operation Desert Storm and began on August 2, 1990. The bill already includes veterans who served from August 2, 1990 to February 28, 1991.

The amendment does not have a fiscal impact on the bill.

Amendments/Appropriation Status

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause. Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$2,960 cash funds for FY 2012-13 to the Department of Revenue, Information Technology Division for the purchase of programming services from the Governor's Office of Information Technology (OIT). The moneys are reappropriated to OIT in FY 2012-13. The appropriation clause further adds an appropriation of \$1,976 cash funds from the License Plate Cash Fund for FY 2012-13, to the Department of Revenue, Division of Motor Vehicles, for the purchase of license plates from Correctional Industries.
