# A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE ABILITY OF A LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO PERMIT, IN
102	ITS DISCRETION, THE COLLECTION OF CHARITABLE
103	SOLICITATIONS FROM MOTORISTS ON A CERTAIN NUMBER OF
104	DAYS PER CALENDAR YEAR.

#### **Bill Summary**

The bill gives state approval for a local government, in its discretion, to allow nonprofit and charitable organizations to solicit

contributions from motorists on a maximum of 5 days per calendar year.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add article 6.5 to title 3 29 as follows: 4 **ARTICLE 6.5** 5 **Charitable Solicitations from Motorists** 6 29-6.5-101. Legislative declaration. (1) THE GENERAL 7 ASSEMBLY HEREBY FINDS, DETERMINES, AND DECLARES THAT: 8 (a) FOR OVER FIFTY YEARS, FIREFIGHTERS ACROSS COLORADO 9 HAVE ENGAGED IN CHARITABLE FUNDRAISING EVENTS TO: 10 (I) SUPPORT MEDICAL RESEARCH OF DEBILITATING DISEASES SUCH 11 AS MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY: 12 PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH CARE AND SUPPORT (II)13 SERVICES, ADVOCACY, AND EDUCATION ON BEHALF OF CHILDREN AND 14 ADULTS WITH NEUROMUSCULAR DISEASES; AND 15 (III) CONDUCT SUMMER CAMPS FOR CHILDREN WITH MUSCULAR 16 DYSTROPHY; 17 (b) THE MOST SUCCESSFUL FUNDRAISING EVENT THAT 18 FIREFIGHTERS HAVE EMPLOYED IS THE SIGNATURE "FILL THE BOOT" 19 CAMPAIGN, WHICH CONSISTS OF FIREFIGHTERS ASKING MOTORISTS PASSING 20 FIRE STATIONS TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE CAUSES SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH 21 (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (1) BY PUTTING MONEY INTO FIREFIGHTER BOOTS 22 OR FACSIMILES OF FIREFIGHTER BOOTS; AND 23 (c) OTHER NONPROFIT AND CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS WOULD 24 BENEFIT FROM THE ABILITY TO SOLICIT AND ACCEPT DONATIONS IN A 25 SIMILAR MANNER.

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1 (2) THEREFORE, IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN 2 ENACTING THIS ARTICLE TO CLARIFY THAT LOCAL GOVERNMENTS MAY, IN 3 THEIR DISCRETION, ALLOW LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL AND 4 FIREFIGHTERS, OTHER LOCAL PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL, AND NONPROFIT 5 OR CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS TO CONDUCT FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES. 6 **29-6.5-102. Definitions.** As used in this article, unless the 7 CONTEXT OTHERWISE REOUIRES: 8 (1) "CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET 9 FORTH IN SECTION 6-16-103 (1), C.R.S. 10 (2) "CHARITABLE PURPOSE" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH 11 IN SECTION 6-16-103 (2), C.R.S. 12 (3) "LOCAL GOVERNMENT" MEANS ANY COUNTY, TOWN, CITY, CITY 13 AND COUNTY, MUNICIPALITY, OR OTHER LOCAL ENTITY HAVING THE 14 AUTHORITY TO ENACT LOCAL ORDINANCES. 15 29-6.5-103. Local government authorization for solicitation of 16 charitable donations. (1) A LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY PERMIT, IN ITS 17 DISCRETION, A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION TO ENGAGE IN A SOLICITATION 18 FOR A CHARITABLE PURPOSE, WHICH SOLICITATION INVOLVES PERSONS 19 STANDING IN OR ADJACENT TO A PUBLIC ROADWAY AND SOLICITING 20 DONATIONS FROM MOTORISTS, IF: 21 (a) THE PERSONS SOLICIT IN AN AREA THAT IS ENTIRELY WITHIN 22 THE JURISDICTION OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT; AND 23 (b) THE NUMBER OF DAYS FOR WHICH A LOCAL GOVERNMENT 24 GRANTS PERMISSION FOR SUCH SOLICITATIONS DOES NOT EXCEED FIVE 25 DAYS IN ANY CALENDAR YEAR PER CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION. 26 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,

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- 1 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
- 2 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
