Summary of Legislation

With strike-below amendment L.001, this bill allows public schools to offer training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). Schools are encouraged to make the training available to all students in grades 9-12 and further encouraged to require that each student successfully complete the training by grade 12. Schools may partner with qualified public and private entities to conduct the training.

School District Impact

This bill encourages schools to offer CPR training, but does not require it. Should a school opt to offer the training, and is unable to identify a qualified volunteer, costs are approximately \$46 per student. This bill allows for the acceptance of gifts, grants and donations to defray any costs.

Pursuant to Section 22-32-143, C.R.S., as specified by House Bill 11-1277, school districts and Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) may submit estimates of fiscal impacts within seven days of a bill's introduction. As of the date of this fiscal note, no summaries of fiscal impacts were submitted by districts or BOCES for this bill.
