Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 02/13/12 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note Was Prepared (Amended by the Senate Transportation Committee 02/14/12)

The Senate Transportation Committee Report amended the bill to impact only vehicles aged four to six years old that are registering for the first time in Colorado, and moved the effective date of the bill to August 8, 2013. These amendment affect the fiscal impact of the bill, as described below.

Updated Analysis

Reason for the Update

By exempting vehicles aged four to six years old, verses the original exemption of vehicles aged four to eight years old, the revenue to the Department of Public Health and Environment's subaccount of the Automobile Inspection and Readjustment Account will be reduced by approximately \$5,000 (rather than \$10,000). Additionally, based on an effective date of August 8, 2013, the bill requires expenditures of \$72,868 in FY 2013-13 and \$71,997 in FY 2014-15.

Amendments/Appropriation Status

The bill neither requires nor contains an appropriation clause for FY 2012-13.

Bill Sponsor Amendments

Staff is not aware of any sponsor amendments to be offered.

Points to Consider

The Departments of Public Health and Environment and Revenue will incur costs associated with the work required to make adjustments to the State Implementation Plan based on the requirements of this bill. Since the bill has been amended to become effective in FY 2013-14, the costs are pushed back to FY 2013-14.
