A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING STUDENT ASSESSMENTS ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, the state board of education (state board) is directed to adopt a system of assessments aligned with state standards in a variety of subjects. The bill directs the state to join as a governing board member a consortium of states that is developing a common set of assessments. For assessments in reading, writing, and mathematics, the state board will rely upon assessments developed by the consortium. For all other assessments, the state board will, to the extent possible, rely Reading Unam ended aγ

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1006, add (1.5)
3	as follows:
4	22-7-1006. Preschool through elementary and secondary
5	education - aligned assessments - adoption - revisions.
6	(1.5) COLORADO SHALL PARTICIPATE AS A GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER,
7	AT LEAST UNTIL JANUARY 1, 2014, IN A CONSORTIUM OF STATES THAT
8	FOCUSES ON THE READINESS OF STUDENTS FOR COLLEGE AND CAREERS BY
9	DEVELOPING A COMMON SET OF ASSESSMENTS. ON OR BEFORE JANUARY
10	1, 2014, AND ON OR BEFORE EACH JANUARY 1 THEREAFTER IF COLORADO
11	IS A GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER OF THE CONSORTIUM OF STATES, THE
12	STATE BOARD IS STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO CONDUCT A FISCAL AND
13	STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT BENEFIT ANALYSIS OF COLORADO'S REMAINING
14	A GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER OF THE CONSORTIUM. IN ADOPTING THE
15	SYSTEM OF ASSESSMENTS THAT IS ALIGNED WITH THE STATE STANDARDS
16	FOR READING, WRITING, AND MATHEMATICS, THE STATE BOARD SHALL
17	RELY UPON ASSESSMENTS <u>DEVELOPED BY THE CONSORTIUM OF STATES.</u>
18	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
19	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
