Summary of Legislation

The bill makes evidence related to substance use inadmissable in a criminal proceeding if the information was obtained as part of a screening or test to determine pregnancy or to provide prenatal care for a pregnant woman.

State Expenditures

The bill is likely to result in an increased number of hearings to determine whether evidence is protected. Any increase in the workload of the trial courts is expected to be minimal and will not require additional appropriations.
