Summary of Legislation

This bill implements the recommendations of the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) in its sunset review of hemodialysis technicians, and continues the regulation of hemodialysis technicians until September 1, 2019. The bill clarifies that the Colorado Department of Health and Environment (CDPHE) may verify the qualifications of hemodialysis technicians while conducting routine surveys of dialysis clinics, and that nurses or physicians who supervise hemodialysis technicians must be licensed.

State Expenditures

Fiscal impact of programs set to expire. This bill continues a program in the CDPHE that is set to repeal, effective July 1, 2012. Under current law, state agencies may be appropriated funds to wind up the affairs of an expiring program for 12 months following the repeal date. To account for the wind-up period, the impact of extending the program beyond the current repeal date is shown as beginning in FY 2013-14, one year after the repeal date. There is no need for an appropriation of the CDPHE's base funding in FY 2012-13, since the program's authorization has not yet expired, and ongoing funding for the program is included in the department's base budget request for FY 2012-13.

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The state expenditures impact for FY 2013-14 reflect the program's anticipated base budget request beginning that year. House Bill 12-1204 requires no additional increases in appropriations. The CDPHE's request for regulation of hemodialysis technicians in FY 2012-13 is \$7,238 and 0.2 FTE.
