A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING IN HIGHER EDUCATION.

Bill Summary

Educational Success Task Force. The bill requires the commission on higher education, after consulting with public institutions of higher education (institutions), to develop criteria for awarding credit for a student's prior learning through work experience, military service, community involvement, or independent study and to define a process to assess prior learning. Beginning with the 2013-14 academic year, public institutions will implement a program awarding academic credit for a

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
3	finds that:
4	(a) Many adults entering Colorado community colleges, state
5	colleges, and universities have acquired college-level knowledge in the
6	workplace, through military service, in the community, or through
7	independent study;
8	(b) A student can save time and money in completing a certificate
9	or degree program if the institution at which the student enrolls assesses
10	the student's college-level knowledge and awards academic credit as
11	appropriate based on the assessment;
12	(c) Awarding academic credit for a student's prior learning will
13	increase the likelihood that the student will complete his or her certificate
14	or degree and achieve his or her academic and economic goals; and
15	(d) Colorado's economic development depends upon a
16	well-educated workforce with the academic credentials necessary to
17	compete in the job market.
18	(2) Therefore, the general assembly declares that it is beneficial
19	to students and to the development of an educated workforce in Colorado
20	for community colleges and other public institutions of higher education
21	to develop a policy or program to recognize a student's college-level
22	learning that takes place outside of the classroom.
23	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-1-125, amend (5)
24	(e) (III); and add (4.5) as follows:

9	(III) Is accredited by a regional AN accrediting agency or
10	association APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF
11	EDUCATION;
12	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
13	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
14	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
15	7, 2012, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2012); except that, if a
16	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
17	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
18	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
19	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
20	November 2012 and will take effect on the date of the official declaration
21	of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
