### **Summary of Legislation**

In elections with statewide ballot measures, the Secretary of State reimburses counties a set amount for each active, registered voter to help offset election costs in the counties. This bill increases the reimbursement provided to counties by \$0.20 for each active, registered voter in the county when statewide measures are on the ballot. Therefore, the per voter reimbursement increases from \$0.70 to \$0.90 in counties with more than 10,000 voters and from \$0.80 to \$1.00 in counties with less than 10,000 or fewer voters.

#### **State Expenditures**

The bill increases costs in the Department of State by \$466,257 per year beginning in FY 2012-13 from the Department of State Cash Fund. Table 1 shows the increased reimbursement amount provided to each county. The fiscal note assumes an 11 percent increase in the number of registered voters between January 1, 2012, and November 6, 2012, because of the upcoming presidential election. It is also assumed that there will be statewide ballot measures in both 2012 and 2013.

Based on these assumptions, total appropriations for county reimbursement will increase to \$2,113,423 in FY 2012-13. Given that the current appropriation to the Department of State for county election reimbursement is \$1,725,699, this analysis estimates that an additional appropriation of \$387,724 is sufficient to cover the increased costs for county reimbursement created in the bill.

### **Local Government Impact**

The bill will increase reimbursement to counties by \$466,257 per year beginning in FY 2012-13 in years when a statewide ballot measure is on the ballot as shown in Table 1. This funding is used to offset the costs of election administration incurred by the counties.
