<u>Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 03/06/12 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note Was Prepared (Amended by the Judiciary Committee 03/08/12)</u>

The Judiciary Committee Report:

- combines the hearing on a motion to transfer a case to juvenile court with the preliminary hearing;
- clarifies that a juvenile convicted as an adult is excluded from mandatory minimum sentencing provisions *unless* the juvenile is convicted of a class 1 felony or for a sex offense that is subject to a sentence of indeterminate commitment; and
- clarifies current law stating that a court may sentence a juvenile as an adult if a juvenile is "convicted of a lesser included or nonenumerated *felony* offense for which criminal charges could not have been originally filed" in the district court, and adds new language stating that the court shall adjudicate the juvenile as a delinquent if the juvenile is convicted of only a misdemeanor offense.

These amendments do <u>not</u> change the fiscal impact of the bill as outlined in the Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note dated March 6, 2012. Legislative Council Staff concurs with this analysis.
