Summary of Legislation

This bill allows the Department of Education to authorize instructors to teach indigenous language courses in schools. The State Board of Education must adopt rules for this authorization. The language taught must be that of a federally recognized native American tribe. The instructor is not required to have a teacher licensure or a baccalaureate degree, providing the instructor only teaches the indigenous language in which he or she is assigned. This bill also allows schools to grant general education credit for those students who successfully complete an indigenous language course.

State Expenditures

The State Board of Education is charged with promulgating rules to determine the criteria in granting the indigenous language authorization. The resources necessary to perform this task are expected to be minimal, and can be met within existing appropriations.
