### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE DEFINITION OF IDENTIFICATION FOR 102 ELECTION-RELATED PURPOSES.

## **Bill Summary**

One of the following is required to be used as identification for election-related purposes:

- ! A valid Colorado driver's license;
- A valid identification card issued by the department of revenue;

- ! A valid United States passport;
- ! A valid employee identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by a governmental entity;
- ! A valid pilot's license issued by the federal aviation administration or other authorized federal agency;
- ! A valid United States military identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector;
- ! A valid medicare or medicaid card issued by the United States health care financing administration that has been issued to an eligible elector who is a resident of a state-licensed facility; or
- ! A valid student identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by an institution of higher education established and existing as an agency of the state of Colorado.

The following documentation is removed from the list of identification that may be used for election-related purposes:

- ! A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the elector;
- ! A certified copy of a birth certificate for the elector issued in the United States; and
- ! Certified documentation of naturalization.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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- 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that:
  - (a) The foundation of our political system is best served by elections that reflect the highest degree of integrity;
  - (b) It is of utmost importance to the continued health of our republic that citizens function as active voters in the political process;
  - (c) A form of photographic identification is the best and most widely accepted manner by which to verify an elector's actual identity;
  - (d) In the case of *Crawford v. Marion County Election Board*, 553 U.S. 181 (2008), the United States supreme court upheld an Indiana law that required photographic identification for voting, finding that any

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1	burden placed on voters by this requirement is limited and offset by the
2	legitimate state interest in protecting the integrity and reliability of the
3	electoral process by deterring voter fraud and protecting voter confidence
4	in elections; and
5	(e) By law, access to state-issued photographic identification is
6	available to senior citizens and low-income citizens.
7	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 1-1-104, amend
8	(19.5) (a) as follows:

4	(IX) A certified copy of a birth certificate for the elector issued in
5	the United States;

7	(XI) A valid student identification card with a photograph of the
8	eligible elector issued by an institution of higher education in Colorado,
9	as defined in section 23-3.1-102 (5), C.R.S. ESTABLISHED AND EXISTING

11	SECTION 3. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
12	January 1, 2013, and applies to elections conducted on or after said date.
