A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE TRANSFER OF THE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY TO THE

102 COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

Joint Budget Committee. The bill transfers the powers, duties, and functions of the Colorado geological survey and the office of the state geologist in the department of natural resources (department) to the Colorado school of mines. The transfer will occur on January 1, 2013. Prior to the transfer, the department and the school of mines shall enter

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into a memorandum of understanding concerning the functions and objectives of the geological survey as transferred to the school of mines, the transfer of employees, the transfer of real and personal property, department contracts, and other specific provisions relating to the transfer. The bill provides for the transfer of unencumbered and unexpended appropriations to the school of mines.

If the department and the school of mines do not enter into a memorandum of understanding on or before December 31, 2012, the transfer will not occur, and the new statutory provisions created in article 41 of title 23 are repealed. The school of mines shall notify the revisor of statutes if the department and the school of mines enter into the memorandum of understanding.

The bill relocates, with amendments, statutory provisions relating to the geological survey and the office of the state geologist to the statutes governing the school of mines and makes conforming amendments relating to the transfer.

18 (3) ON AND AFTER JANUARY 31, 2013, WHENEVER THE EXECUTIVE 19 DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES OR THE 20 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES IS REFERRED TO OR DESIGNATED BY 21 ANY CONTRACT OR OTHER DOCUMENT IN CONNECTION WITH THE POWERS. 22 DUTIES, AND FUNCTIONS TRANSFERRED TO THE COLORADO SCHOOL OF 23 MINES, THE REFERENCE OR DESIGNATION SHALL BE DEEMED TO APPLY TO 24 THE COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES. ALL CONTRACTS ENTERED INTO BY THE 25 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES 26 PRIOR TO JANUARY 31, 2013, IN CONNECTION WITH THE POWERS, DUTIES, 27 AND FUNCTIONS TRANSFERRED TO THE COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES ARE

HEREBY VALIDATED, WITH THE PRESIDENT OF THE COLORADO SCHOOL OF
 MINES SUCCEEDING TO ALL THE RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF SUCH
 CONTRACTS.

4 (4) ON JANUARY 31, 2013, THE UNEXPENDED AND UNENCUMBERED
5 APPROPRIATIONS OF FUNDS FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR MADE TO THE
6 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND ALLOCATED FOR THE
7 COLORADO GEOLOGICAL SURVEY AND OFFICE OF THE STATE GEOLOGIST
