A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING REFORMS TO STATE-ADMINISTERED HEALTH CARE
102 ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS BY SEEKING FEDERAL AUTHORIZATION
103 TO ALLOW THE STATE GREATER FLEXIBILITY IN THE
104 MANAGEMENT OF THE PROGRAMS.

Bill Summary

The bill requires the department of health care policy and financing (state department) to seek a federal waiver to allow for

increased flexibility and efficiency in the management of the medicaid program and the children's basic health plan.

The waiver will seek authorization to determine eligibility categories and income levels and to establish an asset test for eligibility, implement cost-sharing and premiums, encourage the use of private health benefits coverage, and encourage persons to maintain employer-sponsored health insurance. As part of the waiver, the state department may negotiate for capped federal reimbursements with provisions for adjustments in the federal reimbursements for population growth and inflation.

The state department shall report to the general assembly concerning the waiver request and identify necessary changes to state law to implement the reforms requested in the waiver.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 25.5-4-504 as
3 follows:

4 **25.5-4-504. Federal authorization - report.** (1) (a) ON OR
5 BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2012, THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL SEEK A
6 FEDERAL WAIVER OF PROVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL "SOCIAL SECURITY
7 ACT" AUTHORIZING INCREASED FLEXIBILITY AND EFFICIENCY IN THE
8 MANAGEMENT OF COLORADO'S MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. THE
9 WAIVER SHALL BE DESIGNED TO REFORM THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE
10 PROGRAM AND THE CHILDREN'S BASIC HEALTH PLAN BY SEEKING
11 AUTHORIZATION TO:

12 (I) DETERMINE PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY, INCLUDING ELIGIBILITY
13 CATEGORIES AND INCOME LEVELS, AND ESTABLISH AN ASSET TEST FOR
14 ELIGIBILITY;

15 (II) ALLOW FOR INFORMED CONSUMER BEHAVIOR AND
16 APPROPRIATE UTILIZATION OF HEALTH SERVICES THROUGH REASONABLE
17 COST-SHARING AND PREMIUMS;

18 (III) ENCOURAGE THE USE OF THE PRIVATE HEALTH BENEFITS

1 COVERAGE MARKET RATHER THAN PUBLIC BENEFITS SYSTEMS; AND

2 (IV) ENCOURAGE PERSONS WHO HAVE ACCESS TO PRIVATE
3 EMPLOYER-BASED HEALTH BENEFITS TO OBTAIN AND MAINTAIN THOSE
4 BENEFITS.

5 (b) IN SEEKING FEDERAL AUTHORIZATION PURSUANT TO THIS
6 SECTION FOR THE REFORM OF THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AND
7 CHILDREN'S BASIC HEALTH PLAN, THE STATE DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED
8 TO NEGOTIATE A CAP ON FEDERAL REIMBURSEMENTS TO THE STATE WITH
9 PROVISIONS FOR ADJUSTMENTS DUE TO POPULATION GROWTH AND
10 INFLATION.

11 (2) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

12 (a) REPORT TO THE HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE OF
13 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, OR ITS SUCCESSOR COMMITTEE, AND TO
14 THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, OR ITS
15 SUCCESSOR COMMITTEE, CONCERNING FEDERAL AUTHORIZATION
16 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE REFORM OF THE
17 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AND THE CHILDREN'S BASIC HEALTH
18 PLAN; AND

19 (b) IDENTIFY NECESSARY CHANGES TO STATE LAW TO IMPLEMENT
20 REFORMS PURSUANT TO THE FEDERAL AUTHORIZATION.

21 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
22 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
23 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
